GRADE 4

This month, Grade 4 has been reading *Why Mosquitos Buzz in People's Ear* and have practiced putting story events in order using graphic organizers. Grammar wise, they have been covering Long Vowel Pairs and Irregular Verbs. In Math, students have been learning about different graphs. In Science, students have been learning about minerals and have explored physical properties. They learned about a few techniques used by geologists to identify and classify minerals. Such techniques include color, hardness, streak, etc. The students also looked at Mohs Scale of Hardness to measure a mineral's resistance to scratching. In Social Studies, students have been learning about Earth Day and how to protect the planet!

GRADE 5

We have completed so much in the past month! Indian in the Cupboard has since finished and we have moved on to our next novel, *Holes*. In Science, we've learned plenty about the human body and have now moved onto a mini unit on diseases. In Math, we have managed to complete ar recent unit on measurement.
