In Science, we learned about Sir Isaac Newton's three laws of motion. We saw the laws in action via videos and in class demonstrations. We applied what we

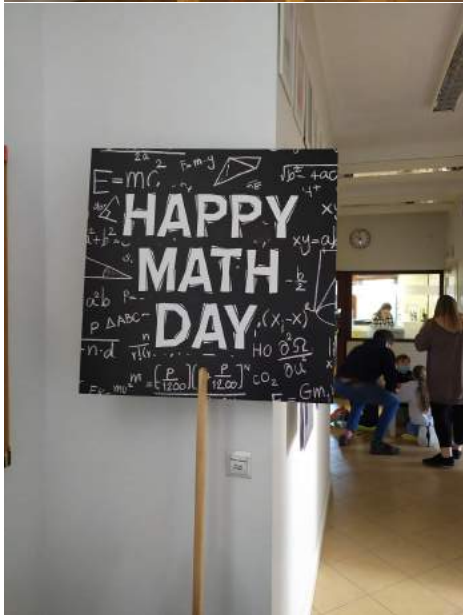
learned to exercises in the CCC book.
