## Grade 2 Newsletter – September in Review

### Introduction...

The second-grade students have started off the school year with a great kick and we've covered various topics in our lessons. We have a lot of exciting plans ahead of us and I'm eager to share them.

In English Language, the students have practiced their reading with intonation and pitch to sound more expressive. Now we are working on our writing making sentences in simple present form with *be* verbs.

In Mathematics, we have been reviewing count numbers and adding or subtracting. Recently we created our own maze puzzle with skip counting numbers!

In Social Studies, we learned about different traditions and celebrations from around the world. These days we learned about an upcoming holiday called The Harvest Moon Festival and everyone has been trying to observe how bright the moon gets at night until the date of the holiday.

In Science, the students studied the characteristics of the five classifications of animals. They are able to differentiate fish, reptiles, mammals, birds, and amphibians by their blood type, skin, and where it lives. We also went outside to do some bird watching and wrote what type of birds we saw.

In our recent Art lesson we did origami and made *ddakji*, which is a traditional South Korean game that is sometimes played during the Harvest Moon Festival. After folding the origami papers, the students also tried to play the game.
