LANGUAGE ARTS

The Grade 6 students have had an incredible month. They've been really busy practicing and preparing their presentations for their class finals which is at the end of this month. The students have also been doing role plays in class in preparation for the speaking contest, to help develop their confidence and vocabulary.

MATHS

Students began looking at the data unit. We learned about both qualitative and quantitative data and about bar graphs, line graphs and pie charts. Students worked on creating their own survey questions, gathering information from their classmates and organizing the information using visuals.





HISTORY
